Dear Chaplains,

Spring has arrived in Mississippi and it shouldn't be far behind, if you are north of us. What a beautiful spring it is! Aren't you grateful for this annual reminder from the Lord that He brings new life from death, beauty from ashes?

I am deeply saddened to report that we recently have had two deaths of relatives in our CWM family. First, my brother, Sam, died on Thursday, March 7. And on the day we held his life celebration, Sunday, March 10, our dear Betty Robertson lost her brother, Richard. We have found comfort from one another and from scores of family and friends. Thank you for your kind words of condolence.

Sam was almost 4 years my senior, and only 62. He had a number of cardio-vascular issues, so while his death was not completely unexpected, it was still a sudden loss. Our family gathered for lunch almost every Sunday after church. At least twice a month, Sam's daughter, Maria, and her family, drove from out-of-town to be with us,

and, if Sam was feeling up to it, he would join us, too. Yesterday, Maria brought the children, and she and I shared our grief that Sam wasn't with us. This special time reminded us that our lives have been altered, and our hearts hurt.

Life-altering experiences, no matter how big or small, can really shake your foundations. But if you have faith in and a personal relationship with our strong, loving God, then no matter what happens you can walk through it with peace, knowing that God, in His goodness, is working all things together for your good.

This tree was made using items from my mother's jewelry box. I chose carefully those things that would remind me of her foundation

in Jesus Christ. This tree speaks to her faith in so many ways: the center jade cross which she wore regularly; pins from women's groups and Bible studies; globes forming the trunk, symbolizing her commitment to missions; the Bible charm reminding me of the hours I saw her pouring over scripture; tiny feet reflecting not only our need to protect the pre-born, but also her grief for the three pre-born children she lost through miscarriage; angels that symbolizing God's ever-present care for us; and finally, the dove and the cross & flame, representing her reliance on the power of God's Spirit. Our parents modeled a rich relationship with God. I'm secure in Him because of their faithfulness.
