is ordained of God to go forth and produce fruit that remains. Working with indigenous church leaders around the globe, we share the Good News of Jesus Christ so that people can be saved. After they surrender their lives to Christ, we invite them to join a new local fellowship of believers — a church — where they can be discipled and encouraged in their walk with Christ.

Perhaps God has been speaking to you about the need to share the Gospel in places where it has not been heard. Pray about joining an upcoming mission with us. No special skills are needed, but you must have a servant heart and a willingness to be used by God in any place He leads.

## Structure of the Mission

Several months before our team arrives, lay persons are trained to serve as care-takers of the new churches. They begin work in each village, visiting house-to-house, holding Bible studies, praying with the sick, and promoting the evangelistic campaign.

When the U.S. team arrives, we join a large contingent of indigenous volunteers — preachers, nurses, doctors, prayer warriors, construction workers — and are deployed into the villages. During the day, the teams offer free medical clinics and begin construction on pavilion churches. In the evenings, evangelistic meetings are conducted, which include music, preaching, testimonies, the Jesus Film, and prayer ministry.

The new churches are usually consecrated before our departure and begin meeting together immediately. Sponsors from the U.S. support them through Christian World Missions for the first three years, providing the pastor's salary, a bicycle and Bible, and funds for their first meeting facility. Our African evangelists make regular visits to all of the churches to instruct and encourage.

## Team Members Needed

**PREACHERS** — Clergy and lay, preaching evangelistic sermons

**LAY SPEAKERS** — Sharing testimonies

**MEDICAL PERSONNEL** — doctors, nurses, even un-trained lay persons can help interview those waiting to be seen

**PRAYER WARRIORS** — Praying for the team and mission, praying with individuals who come for healing or salvation

**BUILDERS**—We will build simple pavilion structures for church meeting places; if you can handle a hammer and screw driver, you're hired!

**SERVANTS** — For the unexpected opportunities to serve—you may be the one ordained by God for just such an eternal moment!

2013 Ghana Mission will be in early February and will be immediately followed by the Nigeria mission. Specific dates will be set in late summer.
