Structure of the Mission

Several months before our team arrives, lay persons are trained to serve as care-takers/pastors of the new churches. They begin work in each village, visiting house-to-house, holding Bible studies, praying with the sick, and promoting the evangelistic campaign.

When the U.S. team arrives, we join indigenous volunteers (preachers, nurses, doctors, construction workers) and are deployed into the villages. During the day, the teams offer free medical clinics, agricultural programs, children's ministry and begin construction on pavilion churches. In the evenings, evangelistic meetings are conducted, which include music, preaching, testimonies, and prayer ministry.

The new churches are usually consecrated before our departure and begin meeting together immediately. Sponsors from the U.S. support them through Christian World Missions for the first three years, providing the pastor's salary, a bicycle and Bible, and funds for their first meeting facility.

Our African evangelists make regular visits to all of the churches to instruct and encourage.

Team Members Needed

PREACHERS — Clergy and lay, preaching evangelistic sermons



LAY SPEAKERS — Sharing testimonies

NURSES - Working under the direction of African nurses and doctors.

AGRICULTURE TEACHERS—Teaching basic informational sessions on vegetable and livestock production for families and farmers in coordination with indigenous agricultural professors.

CHILDREN'S MINISTRY WORKER - Sharing Bible stories and lessons, leading songs and just loving on the children.

PRAYER WARRIORS — Praying for the team and mission, praying with individuals who come for healing or salvation

SERVANTS — For the unexpected opportunities
